THE MARQUER TORAH SCROLL

This important exhibit features a fragment of a Torah scroll which had been desecrated in Germany during WWII. The scroll fragment belonged to the mother of Danny Marquer, who discovered it in her possessions after her passing. Danny's mother had been born and raised in Nazi Germany and later married an American serviceman. The two then moved to the United States. This scroll fragment is an important testament to the attempts of the Nazis to destroy Jewish culture. Danny Marquer will be on hand from Texas to talk with visitors.

Prior to the unveiling, Eva Kor and Helen Rappaport, who is also a twin survivor of the medical experiments of Dr. Josef Mengele at Auschwitz, will be at CANDLES to speak with visitors about their experiences. Eva and Helen will be on hand at CANDLES beginning at 1pm.

We will also observe the 73rd anniversary of Kristallnacht with Walter Sommers, an eyewitness to the attacks.
