

# Marquer Scroll on Loan to Candles Museum

You can catch an important piece of Jewish and World War II history in Terre Haute. A fragment of a Torah scroll is on display at the CANDLES Holocaust Museum. An American discovered it in his mother's possessions. She lived in Nazi Germany.

The museum says this scroll fragment is an important testament to the attempts by the Nazis to destroy Jewish culture.

This Torah scroll is on loan to the museum [from the Florence and Laurence Spungen Family Foundation].

At the event, I met a local guy (Kiel Majewski) who volunteers at a prison...and here are a couple bits of feedback he posted to his (Facebook) page:



“I was there for the unveiling....Amazing experience...”

“Today I met three survivors. Two of which were survivors of Auschwitz 1, and one of which was a survivor of the Night Of Broken Glass. WOW! I was captured in this experience, in their lives, and their moments of reality became mine. As one of the two programs came to an end, I met Eva and she spoke something to me that just humbled my soul. She told me that she understands my purpose. I, in all of my years have never been told something like that by such a person as her. This second service was amazing as well. I saw a group of people (survivors and children of survivors from both Allied and German Forces embrace in forgiveness and love.....Eva is a remarkable woman. I hope to have a tenth of the impact that she does on people in my life.”
