## McWherter Library Lectures and Exhibit Retrospective continued

Thirty years ago, a Pennsylvania stamp collector set out to uncover an emotionally-charged paper trail portraying the tragedy and persecution of the Holocaust. The collection has grown to more than 250 pieces of Holocaust-related materials - stamps, postcards, letters, manuscripts - that provide a painful, yet awakening reminder of the historical connection made through written word.

The collection, known as the Spungen Holocaust Postal Collection, now travels the country along with collector and philatelist Danny Spungen.
