Camp Hay (Australia) Internment Camps

The Australian military selected Hay with its small population, road/railway connections, clay soil and the Murrumbidgee River water supply.

The internees were fortunate the Australian guards were kind and did their best to adapt. Camp 7 internees for example created schools, a quasi-Parliament, theater groups, work details and a banking system. In early 1941 the Commandant allowed the internees to have money printed outside of Camp 7 at the local newspaper, <u>The Riverine Grazier</u>.

A series of three denominations were issued in March-April 1941, designed by internee Georg Teltscher to illustrate life within Camp 7. Georg took the liberty to use a lot of sarcastic humor throughout the design (in sharp contrast to the scrip made for the ghettos and concentration camps in Europe).
